Obama Care many have heard about it and thought what is that? Obama Care, aka "The Affordable Care Act", goes back to 1989. Obama did not invent it but in 2008 it was put on the democratic platform. But most republicans liked it, even Romney was in favor of it, so it could have been called "Romney Care."
